Human Trafficking: Where are we now?

Human trafficking remains a serious and ongoing problem in the United States, with federal data confirming that traffickers continue to exploit both adults and children for commercial sex and forced labor. California, Florida, and Texas consistently report the highest case volumes nationwide. And because federal agencies record only the cases that reach the justice system, the true scope of exploitation is far greater than what appears in official statistics—underscoring the urgent need for coordinated prevention, protection, and survivor support efforts.

Florida is among the nation's most affected states, and Tampa is widely recognized as a major trafficking hub due to its tourism, interstate corridors, and vulnerable youth populations. Local agencies report hundreds of cases each year, reflecting the scale of exploitation in the region.

By providing immediate, on demand air transport, Invisible Angels removes survivors from dangerous environments within hours—not days—bridging the critical gap between identification and safety. Whether transporting survivors to secure safe homes, supporting law enforcement during active investigations and extractions, or enabling survivors to share their stories on national stages, Invisible Angels delivers rapid, trauma informed aviation support that disrupts trafficking networks and provides safe passage for survivor recovery.

2026 1st Quarter Impact

Since January 1st, Invisible Angels has led one of its most impactful operational periods to date, executing 36 total missions across the United States and internationally. This includes 32 dedicated rescue flights, 4 private missions using the Invisible Angels aircraft, and 30 relocations arranged using major air carriers. Through these coordinated efforts, 38 survivors have been transported to safety, including six rescued internationally and an entire family of six removed from a life-threatening situation in partnership with the Department of Transportation, Homeland Security, and Federal law enforcement.

Invisible Angels also strengthened survivor advocacy by flying four survivors to national conferences, ensuring their voices are heard in rooms where change is shaped. The organization completed two private courtesy flights enabling a safe home director to attend critical meetings at the Governor's Office, and transported one state law enforcement official to interview a survivor in a high priority national case.

Beyond aviation operations, Invisible Angels delivered over 2,000 pieces of brand-new clothing—made possible through our generous partners Calvin Klein, Nautica, Lucky Brand, Brooks Brothers, Cabi, and Tommy Hilfiger—to safe homes and rescue organizations, providing dignity, comfort, and immediate support to survivors. Together, these achievements underscore Invisible Angels' unwavering commitment to rapid response, survivor dignity, and front-line partnership in the fight against human trafficking.
